Yes! It's time for Austin Summerfest 2019! It's time to gather in central Texas to see old friends, make new ones, attend the swapfest and all the events at Austin Summerfest 2019 and the 2019 ARRL South Texas Section Convention. The Summer Meeting of the Texas VHF-FM Society is also hosted at this event.

Friday, August 2nd and Saturday, August 3rd, Crowne Plaza Hotel, 6121 North IH 35, Austin, TX 78752. If you're familiar with the area, it's the northeast area of the IH35/E Hwy 290 intersection on the north side of town, about 1.25 miles south of Hwy 183.

Advance registration is closed, but you can show up and register on-site (\$10 per individual, at the door; children 17 and under admitted free). Everyone is welcome to attend! Talk-in will be available on the Austin Amateur Radio Club (AARC) repeater: **146.94 MHz**, **107.2** tone, — offset. Once you get to the event site, stroll on up to Room 505 - the Hospitality Suite (sponsored by AARC). Stop by, say "Hi!" and grab a snack.

You'll find the Swapfest going on in the Grand Ballroom (the big room behind the registration area). You'll need your swapfest badge to get in. There will be a number of vendors ready to help you with their latest products, as well as hams with tables of gear available for purchase.
