Ham radio experiment. Our high altitude balloon is now over the Azores, it looks like the predicted path is going to take us over Africa and the middle east again. We expect this balloon to stay up for months and circle the globe many times. We have tracking on APRS and a back up tracking on WSPR. the little 10 milliwatt transmitter is being heard thousands of miles away. We have set up a easy tracking page that has buttons to track it on both primary and secondary systems. This balloon is designed and engineered to fly at approx. 41,000 ft. Yesterday average speed was 100 mph.
