The Casual Contester

You do not need a big station to have big fun! Contesting is a great way to build the skills to increase your proficiency in one or more modes. I am not a die-hard contester, but I will participate in contests of various levels from time to time for a variety of reasons, some of which you may find appealing to you. I am looking to earn Worked All States, DXCC and to prove my station capabilities. Others may be chasing Grid Squares, Worked US Counties, VUCC or other accomplishments.

3 Station Requirements for Contesting

- A radio and antenna(s)
- A computer (preferably interfaced with radio, but not required)
- Computer-based logging software that will outputting both a Cabrillo formatted file for contest submission and an ADIF formatted file for uploading to LOTW, ClubLog or QRZ.com. There are many options from freeware to networked Windows-based such as N3FJP. I use N1MM a free Windows based software package.

Keys to Having a Successful Campaign

- Work a lot of stations
- Work as many "multipliers" as possible
- Work smart, know when to change bands
- Understand Propagation
- Know Your Limits Choose the Operating category that is right for you. Contest Categories are created to keep the playing field level when it comes to scoring.
 - ☐ Most Common Categories include:
 - Single operator
 - Packet-assisted or unassisted
 - Power Levels: QRP, Low, High
 - Single band and/or mode (some contests)
 - Multi-op, single transmitter
 - Multi-op, multi-transmitter
 - Rookie

Time Commitment

Almost always on weekends with starting and ending times vary by contest. Some contests are as short as 4 hours and some are as long as 48 hours. Maximum allowed operating hours also vary.

MARS Announces HF Skills Exercise – 6/26/2020

Members of the Military Auxiliary Radio System (MARS) will conduct an HF skills exercise July 20 - 24 to hone their operating skills and messaging-handling capabilities.

MARS members will be reaching out to the amateur radio community via the 60-meters Channel 1 Net (5330.5 kHz dial) twice a day, the SATERN HF net (14.265 MHz), and by contacting various stations via HFLink throughout the exercise. MARS members will be requesting assistance with collecting county status information as well as airport weather information, called METARs. MARS members will also be passing ICS 213 messages to numerous Department of Defense (DoD), federal, and amateur radio addressees.

This exercise will be announced via WWV at 00:10 and via WWVH at 00:50 starting on or about July 13. WWV and WWVH listeners will be asked to take an online listener survey. This HF radio training event will not impact regular communications. — Thanks to Paul English, Chief, Army MARS

Radio Amateur's Call for Help Relayed from across the Atlantic – 06/25/2020

When Richard Tashner, N2EO, of Massapequa, New York, suffered a medical emergency on May 18, his DMR radio was closer than his phone. His call for help was answered by Maxis Johnston, GMOMRJ, who put out a call for "anyone in the states."

Kent County Amateur Radio Club member Ken Dix, KB2KBD, in Delaware heard the call on the local 146.91 MHz repeater, which was linked to the North American talk group. Dix called authorities in Tashner's vicinity, and help was dispatched.

Dix said the dispatcher in New York was able to hear part of the call and was amazed at how an amateur radio communication had gone from New York to Scotland to Delaware and then back to New York. The dispatcher expressed surprise at how quickly the information had been relayed across the Atlantic. The Delaware repeater, at the Delaware State Communications complex, is set on C4FM Fusion and linked to DMR on "America's Net." — Thanks to the ARES E-Letter via Jerry Palmer, N3KRX

CAMSAT CAS-6 Satellite Antenna Deployed, Transponder Activated – 06/23/2020

CAMSAT reports that the VHF-UHF antenna on the CAS-6 satellite, launched last December 20, has been deployed and its linear amateur radio transponder activated. CAMSAT's Alan Kung, BA1DU, reports that the CW beacon and GMSK telemetry are not working properly at this time, with only carriers being transmitted.

"We will try to diagnose and then determine whether the CW and telemetry data stream transmission can be recovered," Kung said.

The U/V linear transponder uplink is 435.280 MHz, with the downlink at 145.925 MHz. The inverting passband is 20 kHz wide. The CW telemetry beacon is on 145.910 MHz. The AX.25 4.8 kbps GMSK telemetry frequency is 145.890 MHz. — Thanks to Alan Kung, BA1DU
